Disciples of the Way is eagerly working toward the day that will finally unite everyone under the Cross of Christ, the Lamb, because it is His forgiveness that saves us from our sins.

Have you noticed that Christ, the Lamb, is right at the center of this quilt? There is a good reason for this in Revelation. There are 1.3+ billion Muslims in the world today who believe Jesus was not crucified and died on the cross but they believe Allah lifted him up--alive--to himself to save him from the rebellious Jews and the hands of the Romans (Quran 4:175). According to the Quran, Muslims are willing to give Jesus, the son of Mary, all the credit for the many miracles recorded in the Bible. However, they deny the miracle of the Cross, the very essence for their atonement in the paschal Lamb who takes away the sin of the world. Muslims call Jesus the Word of God, the

Spirit of God, born of the virgin Mary, who lived a sinless life and had power over demons, but they deny him as the crucified and risen Son of God who came to take away the sin of the world.

DOW's Mission is God's Mission. God's promise of salvation in the crucified and risen Christ, the Lamb in Rev. 7:9-11 is DOW's vision for all people from all nations on earth as it will be in heaven. Our mission statement is "Reaching, Teaching, Living, and Serving people from all nations by people of all nations" whose lives have been transformed by the way of the Cross all the way to heaven by Faith in Jesus our Savior. To Him be glory now and forever.



Shown above are a few Muslim students of DOW's Bible Study Group who hung the "Quilt of Hope for All Nations" in our Bible Study room. Many of our Muslim friends are proud to see their flag in this quilt, but curious about the Cross of Christ being right in the center of it. Muslims believe man is born good (fitrah) therefore they do not think it necessary for an atoning sacrifice for their sin. However, before they can welcome the love of God in John 3:16 they must confess and acknowledge their sin in John 3:14 & 15 and believe in Christ who was crucified and lifted up for their own sins. *"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."* John 3:14-15. This quilt gives us the opportunity to talk about the Hope that we all have in the crucified and risen Christ and the confidence Christians have to be reunited with Him in heaven -- with our friends from all nations. Amen.
